Next time you are in your backyard or in a local park, notice the manu around you. If you are unsure of which manu you spotted, use the link below to discover.

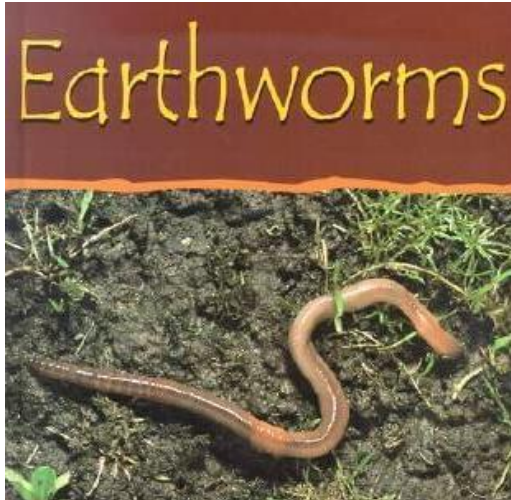
